Shelter Movers is a national, volunteer-powered charitable organization providing moving and storage services at no cost to survivors fleeing abuse. We are the only service of this kind in Canada. Every year, in collaboration with business partners and community agencies, our teams contribute over 70,000 hours to support families transitioning to a life free of violence.

Shelter Movers has been operational since 2016 and currently serves families experiencing abuse in Vancouver, Waterloo, Toronto, Ottawa, Montreal, and Nova Scotia. We are growing and looking to add caring and compassionate people to our team.

About this role

The Chapter Director oversees daily operations of a chapter to realize Shelter Movers' mission, supporting survivors of abuse. Working collaboratively with national Functional Directors, the Chapter Director provides leadership and shared accountability for all functions underpinning a chapter of Shelter Movers.

Responsibilities

- Providing leadership and managing the efforts of staff to ensure achievement of annual targets and objectives
- Collaboratively developing local strategies with National Functional Directors in regards to: Finance, Fund Development, Volunteer Engagement & Retention, Recruitment, Marketing & Communications, and Operations to support SM's mission
- Overseeing and reporting on the chapter's compliance to national standards, procedures and results for all functions
- Promoting Shelter Movers' reputation and brand through word of mouth and social / mainstream media
- Fostering strategic relationships with key local partners, including elected officials, provincial and regional sector partners, major donors, media, business supporters, shelters, and other agencies to drive referrals and fortify donor relations
- Serving as primary spokesperson for the chapter in all public facing matters
- Managing the chapter's finances, operating within approved budgets; ensuring maximum resource utilization
- Serving as signatory on all major bank transactions
- Researching opportunities to engage new referral sources or increase a chapter's capacity
- Serving as final back stop when handling client concerns and volunteer applicant eligibility
- Other duties as assigned by the Executive Director

Skills and Qualifications

- Demonstrated success in a senior organizational leadership role, preferably in the nonprofit sector
- Strong analytical, problem-solving skills with the ability to manage multiple projects under tight timelines

- A collaborative and compassionate leadership style to build trust and inspire others to achieve common goals
- Experience managing large teams (over 20 staff) using volunteer management approaches
- Excellent judgment in setting priorities, problem, and solution identification
- A proven record executing fundraising campaigns and events
- Grant writing experience is an asset
- Experience with organizational and system-level strategic visioning and planning
- Budget development experience, ability to understand a financial statement
- Advanced verbal and written communication and negotiation skills
- Advanced understanding and interest in gender studies, including anti-racist, anti-oppressive frameworks and intersectionality of challenges faced by women and particularly survivors of abuse in the local community
- Strong ethics and strives for integrity and excellence in all areas of responsibility
